We can Help!

Here are some ways to raise funds in support of **Amy's Walk**. You may have other ideas as well.

- Ask for a lump sum donation—any amount that the donor feels they can give is appropriate.
- Set a monetary amount – for example, \$3 for each mile of the walk—and this gets you a \$15 donation for the 5K walk!
- Ask a local business to pay your registration fee and tell them you will collect cans and bottles and donate all the proceeds to Amy's Walk.

Remember, all money must be turned in at the start of the walk.

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior that is ongoing and is meant to control, dominate, and manipulate a chosen victim or victims. In homes where domestic violence occurs, there is often **child abuse**. If there are animals; pet abuse as well. Abuse impacts all of us, directly and indirectly, and all of society is affected by this pervasive public health and safety issue. Many times domestic violence leads to **homelessness**.

On average, **one in four** people are in a relationship that is abusive and dysfunctional (at least once in their lifetime). It takes many forms including physical, emotional, psychological, sexual, financial, and judicial abuse. Abuse can be hard to understand from the “outside,” but to the victims in these difficult situations, it is a “logical” response to the often longstanding patterns of abuse they are familiar with.

Many victims have grown up in abusive homes and have learned that this is the “norm.” They have seen, heard, and often experienced abuse, neglect, and/or maltreatment and continue to find themselves in this type of dynamic as teenagers, and later as adults. Trying to “fix” an unhealthy domestic or dating relationship without advocacy and guidance is dangerous for the victim, their children and even their pets. Don't do it alone! A plan of action must be made in advance with the right support.
